As a high school SENIOR you can receive priority registration for fall 2014 classes. Here's how:

1. Apply online and get a Palomar student ID number.
 2. Take the assessment test – offered at many high schools and at the Palomar College Assessment Office.
 3. Participate in orientation with a Palomar College counselor or online.
 4. Visit a Palomar College counselor to develop your unique education plan.
- With these four steps you receive a July 2 registration appointment to sign up for your fall 2014 classes*

ENGLISH ELIGIBILITY

** AP English Lit/Comp or Lang/Comp: 3 or higher	Students will be eligible to enroll in English 202, 203, Phil 115
SAT Writing: 500 or higher	Students will be eligible to enroll in English 100/college-level English
ACT Writing: 22 or higher	
CSU EPT: 147 or higher	
CSU EAP: Ready for college-level English	

MATH ELIGIBILITY

** AP Calculus AB: 3 or higher	Students will be eligible to enroll in Math 141
** AP Calculus BC: 3 or higher	Students will be eligible to enroll in Math 200/205
** AP Statistics: 3 or higher	Students will be eligible to enroll in Math 100-120, Psy/Soc 205/college-level math*
SAT Math: 550 or higher	
ACT Math: 23 or higher	
CSU ELM: 49 or higher	
CSU EAP: Ready for college-level math	
CSU EAP: Ready for college-level math, conditional: must complete an approved math class senior year of high school	*Students wishing to place into Math 130 or higher (ex. precalculus or calculus) will still need to take the assessment test

Placement from other colleges is also acceptable.

**Students with AP scores should send official records to Palomar College from College Board.
